

HITM2230 - Medical Science for Health Information Professionals

Description:	This course provides students with an understanding of fundamental concepts of pathological conditions and therapeutics associated with multiple medical conditions. A working knowledge of the nature and cause of disease processes, including etiology, signs, symptoms and diagnostic evaluation, is covered. Appropriate treatment modalities are covered for each body system, including pharmacological, preventative, palliative, therapeutic and surgical. This allows health information professionals to apply diagnosis and treatment knowledge to code assignment according to current guidelines.

Build upon the basic framework of disease processes and treatments for pursuing medical research. 9. Differentiate among preventative, palliative and therapeutic treatments.
